
Overview:

After several years of continuous growth marked by a peak of 47.8 bln US\$ in 2008, the value of the exports of Azerbaijan contracted sharply by 69.2 percent in 2009 but increased again in 2010 by 44.9 percent to amount to 21.3 bln US\$ (see table 1 and graph 1). The development on the imports side is less pronounced with an increase by 7.8 percent in 2010 to 6.6 bln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). The trade surplus went up from 8.6 bln US\$ in 2009 to 14.7 bln US\$ in 2010 (see graph 1). By MDG regions, the largest surplus was recorded with Developed Europe (+8.9 bln US\$) (see graph 2). Other major surpluses were recorded with South-eastern Asia (+2.0 bln US\$) and Developed North America (+1.8 bln US\$). In 2010, imports were more diversified across partners than exports: 15 major partners accounted for 80 percent of imports (compared to 11 major partners for exports) (see graph 3).

Exports	Profile:
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In 2010, Azerbaijan's exports were almost exclusively (94.5 percent) mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3) (see table 1). Their exports increased on average by 39.0 percent each year since 2006. Italy, France and Israel were the top three markets for exports in 2010 and accounted for 50.0 percent of exports (see table 4). Main exported products were petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, crude (HS code 2709), petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710) and petroleum gases and other gaseous hydrocarbons (HS code 2711) (see table 3).





Imports Profile:

Machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) represented nearly half of imported goods (40.7 percent) in 2010 (see table 2). Other major commodity groups included manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) and food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) respectively with 21.6 and 17.1 percent of imports. Over the last three years, top imported products were motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport (HS code 8703), wheat and meslin (HS code 1001) and cigars, cheroots, cigarillos and cigarettes (HS code 2402) (see table 5).
