Overview:

From 2005 to 2009, exports of Central African Republic decreased on average by 7.7 percent each year. It experienced a significant drop of 29.5 percent in 2009 and amounted to 80.5 mln US\$ (see table 1 and graph 1). During the same period, imports increased on average by 3.4 percent each year to 211.7 mln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). The trade balance recorded a deficit of 131.2 mln US\$ compared to a deficit of 70.8 mln US\$ in 2008 (see graph 1). Trade with almost all MDG regions were in deficit, with Sub-Saharan Africa recording a deficit amounting to 33.9 mln US\$ (see graph 2). In 2009, trade was concentrated among a few partners: 4 (respectively 12) major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports (respectively imports) (see graph 3).

Graph 1: Total imports, exports and trade balance



Exports Profile:

In 2009, exports of inedible crude materials (excluding fuels), animal and vegetable oils, fats, waxes (SITC sections 2+4) dropped by 24.3 percent and accounted for 93.3 percent of exported goods (see table 1). Exports of miscellaneous manufactured articles (SITC section 8) increased by 531.9 percent and represented 1.5 percent of exports. Belgium, China and France were the top three markets for exports in 2009 (see table 4). Inedible crude materials (except fuels), animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes (SITC sections 2+4) represented all exports to China and the majority of exports to Belgium and France. From 2007 to 2009, top exported products included diamonds, whether or not worked, but not mounted or set (HS code 7102), wood in the rough, whether or not stripped of bark or sapwood (HS code 4403) and wood sawn or chipped lengthwise, sliced or peeled (HS code 4407) (see table 3). They accounted respectively for 61.8, 20.4 and 10.5 percent of exports in 2009.



Imports Profile:

Imports were composed of 35.9 percent of food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1), 22.0 percent of machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) and 14.6 percent of chemicals and related products, n.e.s. (SITC section 5) (see table 2). From 2007 to 2009, top imported products included medicaments (excluding goods of heading 30.02, 30.05 or 30.06) (HS code 3004), diamonds, whether or not worked, but not mounted or set (HS code 7102) and wheat or meslin flour (HS code 1101) (see table 5).
