
Overview:

After several years of continuous growth marked by a peak of 8.2 bln US\$ in 2008, the value of the exports of Sri Lanka dropped in 2009 (by 12.9 percent) but increased again in 2010 by 16.6 percent to amount to 8.3 bln US\$ slightly above the peak reached in 2008 (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports recorded a peak of 13.6 bln US\$ in 2008 before dropping in 2009 (by 30.8 percent) and bouncing back in 2010 by 31.0 percent to 12.4 bln US\$. This resulted in a trade deficit of 4.0 bln US\$ in 2010, higher than the 2009 deficit of 2.3 bln US\$ (see graph 1). Large deficits were recorded with Southern Asia (-2.8 bln US\$), South-eastern Asia (-2.1 bln US\$) and Eastern Asia (-2.0 bln US\$) (see graph 2). Trade recorded a surplus of 1.4 bln US\$ with Developed North America. Sri Lanka's trade was diversified across partners: in 2010, 20 (respectively 16) major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports (respectively imports) (see graph 3).

Exports	Profile:
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In 2010, exports were composed of 45.9 percent of miscellaneous manufactured articles (SITC section 8), 26.6 percent of food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) and 14.5 percent of manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6). USA, United Kingdom and India were the three largest markets for exports (see table 4). The majority of exports to USA and United Kingdom were composed respectively of 82.1 and 85.4 percent of miscellaneous manufactured articles (SITC section 8). From 2008 to 2010, top exported products were tea, whether or not flavoured (HS code 0902), women's or girls' suits, ensembles, jackets, blazers, dresses, skirts (HS code 6204) and women's or girls' slips, petticoats, briefs, panties, nightdresses (HS code 6108) (see table 3).

Graph 3: Partner concentration of trade in 2010



Imports Profile:

Imports in 2010 were composed of 28.5 percent of manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6), 21.4 percent of machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) and 16.7 percent of mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3). From 2008 to 2010, top products for imports were petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710), petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, crude (HS code 2709) and other knitted or crocheted fabrics (HS code 6006) (see table 5).
