Overview:

After several years of continuous growth marked by a peak of 37.6 bln US\$ in 2008, the value of Colombia's exports dropped by 12.7 percent in 2009 but bounced back in 2010 by 21.2 percent to amount to 39.8 bln US\$ (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports showed a similar development with an increase of 23.7 percent to 40.7 bln US\$ in 2010 (see table 2 and graph 1). This resulted in a trade deficit of 863.0 mln US\$, higher than the 44.7 mln US\$ deficit in 2009 (see graph 1). By MDG regions, the trade balance recorded surpluses with Developed North America (+6.3 bln US\$) and Sub-Saharan Africa (+280.3 mln US\$) (see graph 2). The trade balance recorded a deficit with Eastern Asia amounting to 4.3 bln US\$. In 2010, trade was diversified across partners: 15 major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports and 14 for imports (see graph 3). USA was the top partner with 43.1 percent of Colombia's exports (see table 4).

Graph 1: Total imports, exports and trade balance



Exports Profile:

In 2010, mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3) accounted for 56.7 percent of exported goods (see table 1). Other major commodity groups included food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) and manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6), which accounted for 10.8 and 8.4 percent of exports, respectively. In 2010, exports to the USA, the top partner, were largely mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3) (70.4 percent). Other major partners included China and Ecuador. Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, crude (HS code 2709), the top product for exports over the last three years, accounted for 33.6 percent of exports in 2010. Other major products for exports included coal; briquettes, ovoids and similar solid fuels manufactured from coal (HS code 2701) and petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710) (see table 3).





Graph 2: Trade Balance by MDG Regions in 2010









Imports Profile:

In 2010, machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) accounted for 40.0 percent of total imports in 2010 followed by chemicals and related products, n.e.s. (SITC section 5) and manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) respectively with 18.3 and 15.7 percent (see table 2). Top products for imports over the last three years were other aircraft (for helicopters, example, aeroplanes); spacecraft (HS code 8802), motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport (HS code 8703), and petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710) (see table 5).
