
Imports: CIF, by origin

Overview:

After several years of continuous growth marked by a peak of 96.9 bln US\$ in 2008, the value of the exports of Finland contracted sharply by 35.1 percent in 2009 and amounted to 62.9 bln US\$ but bounced back in 2010 by 10.4 percent to amount to 69.4 bln US\$, still well below its 2008 level (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports showed a similar development with an increase of 12.2 percent in 2010 to 68.2 bln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). This resulted in a trade surplus of 1.2 bln US\$ in 2010 (see graph 1). By MDG regions, large surpluses were recorded with Developed North America (+2.9 bln US\$) and Western Asia (+1.5 bln US\$) (see graph 2). Trade was in deficit with Commonwealth of Independent States (-5.3 bln US\$) and Eastern Asia (-0.8 bln US\$). Trade was diversified across partners: respectively 20 and 15 major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports and imports (see graph 3).

In 2010, machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) was the largest commodity group for exports and represented 32.4 percent of exported goods despite its trade dropping by 11.5 percent (see table 1). Exports of manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) accounted for 31.6 percent of total exports and increased by 33.4 percent. Major destinations for exports were Sweden, Germany and Russian Federation (see table 4). Over the last three years, top export commodities were electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy (HS code 8517), paper and paperboard, coated on one or both sides with kaolin (HS code 4810) and petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710) (see table 3).



Graph 3: Partner concentration of trade in 2010



Imports Profile:

Similar to exports, machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) was the largest commodity group accounting for 28.7 percent of total imports (see table 2). Other major commodity groups included mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3) and manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) respectively with 18.4 and 12.3 percent of imports. Major imported products over the last three years were petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, crude (HS code 2709), electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy (HS code 8517) and motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport (HS code 8703) (see table 5).
