
Overview:

After several years of continuous growth marked by a peak of 5.4 bln US\$ in 2008, Iceland's exports decreased sharply in 2009 by 24.2 percent but bounced back in 2010 by 13.4 percent to 4.6 bln US\$, still well below its 2008 level (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports exhibited a similar pattern with an increase of 8.9 percent and reached 3.9 bln US\$ in 2010 (see table 2 and graph 1). This resulted in a trade surplus of 674.5 mln US\$ (see graph 1). By MDG regions, large deficits were recorded with Latin America and the Caribbean (-491.6 mln US\$), Eastern Asia (-211.7 mln US\$) and Developed North America (-147.5 mln US\$) (see graph 2). By partners, exports were more concentrated than imports: 10 major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports compared to 15 major partners for imports (see graph 3).

In 2010, manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) accounted for 45.8 percent of total exports (see table 1). Other major commodity groups included food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) and machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) respectively with 39.8 and 4.9 percent of exported goods. Top markets for exports were the Netherlands, Germany and United Kingdom (see table 4). Exports to the Netherlands and Germany were largely manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) while 80.7 percent of exports to the United Kingdom were food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1). From 2008 to 2010, top products for exports were unwrought aluminium (HS code 7601), fish fillets and other fish meat (whether or not minced) (HS code 0304) and fish, dried, salted or in brine (HS code 0305) (see table 3).



Imports Profile:

Machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) accounted for 27.2 percent of imports in 2010 (see table 2). Other major commodity groups for imports were inedible crude materials (except fuels), animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes (SITC sections 2+4) and mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3) respectively accounting for 15.7 and 13.0 percent of imports. In addition to artificial corundum, whether or not chemically defined (HS code 2818), other major imported goods over the period from 2008 to 2010 were petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710) and carbon electrodes, carbon brushes, lamp carbons, battery carbons (HS code 8545) (see table 5).
