## Imports: CIF, by origin

## Overview:

After several years of continuous growth marked by a peak of 71.2 bln US\$ in 2008, the value of the exports of Kazakhstan contracted sharply in 2009 (by 39.3 percent) but bounced back in 2010 by 32.5 percent to amount to 57.2 bln US\$, still well below its 2008 level (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports, on the other hand, continued to decrease in 2010 (by 15.4 percent) to reach 24.0 bln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). This resulted in a trade surplus of 33.2 bln US\$, higher than the 2009 surplus of 14.8 bln US\$ (see graph 1). This surplus is largely accounted for by trade with Developed Europe (+23.3 bln US\$) (see graph 2). However, trade recorded a deficit of 1.9 bln US\$ with the Commonwealth of Independent States. By partner, trade was relatively diversified in 2010; 15 (respectively 13) major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports (respectively imports) (see graph 3).

Graph 1: Total imports, exports and trade balance



## **Exports Profile:**

Since 2006, exports of mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3) increased on average by 11.8 percent each year and accounted for more than twothirds (71.7 percent) of exported goods in 2010 (see table 1). Other major commodity group for exports included manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6); it accounted for 13.0 percent of exports. In 2010, major destinations for exports were China, Italy and France; the combined value accounted for 42.2 percent of total exports (see table 4). Petroleum oils, crude (HS code 2709), the top export commodity accounted for 64.6 percent of exports in 2010 (see table 3). Other major products were refined ferro-alloys (HS code 7202) and copper and copper alloys, unwrought (HS code 7403).





## **Imports Profile:**

In 2010, Kazakhstan imports were mostly composed of machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7), manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) and chemicals and related products, n.e.s. (SITC section 5) (see table 2). They accounted respectively for 40.5, 18.1 and 11.9 percent of imports. Top imported products over the last three years were petroleum oils, crude (HS code 2709), other tubes and pipes (for example, welded, riveted or similarly closed) (HS code 7305) and petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710) (see table 5).
