Overview:

After several years of continuous growth marked by a peak of 422.0 bln US\$ in 2008, the value of the exports of the Republic of Korea dropped by 13.9 percent in 2009 and amounted to 363.5 bln US\$ (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports showed a similar development with a decline of 25.8 percent in 2009 to 323.1 bln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). This resulted in a trade surplus of 40.4 bln US\$ in 2009 compared to a deficit of 13.3 bln US\$ in 2008 (see graph 1). By MDG regions, trade recorded large surpluses with Eastern Asia (+50.4 bln US\$), Latin America & the Caribbean (+14.4 bln US\$) and Developed Europe (+10.5 bln US\$) (see graph 2). Trade deficits were recorded with two MDG regions: Developed Asia-Pacific (-37.2 bln US\$) and Western Asia (-35.7 bln US\$). Trade, especially exports, was well diversified across partners: in 2009, 24 (respectively 17) major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports (respectively imports) (see graph 3).

Graph 1: Total imports, exports and trade balance



Exports Profile:

Machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) accounted for the majority of exported goods in 2009 with a share of 56.8 percent. Other major commodity groups for exports included manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) and chemicals and related products, n.e.s. (SITC section 5) respectively with 13.2 and 10.3 percent of exports. China, USA and Japan were the three major markets for exported goods in 2009. From 2007 to 2009, top exported products included cruise ships, excursion boats, ferry-boats, cargo ships, barges (HS code 8901), electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy (HS code 8517) and motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport (HS code 8703) (see table 3).





Graph 3: Partner concentration of trade in 2009





Imports Profile:

In 2009, imports were composed of 30.0 percent of machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7), 28.4 percent of mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3) (in majority crude petroleum oils) and 13.4 percent of manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) (see table 2). Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, crude (HS code 2709), electronic integrated circuits microassemblies (HS code 8542) and petroleum gases and other gaseous hydrocarbons (HS code 2711) were the three major imported goods from 2007 to 2009 (see table 5).
