
Overview:

After three years of continuous growth marked by a peak of 1.6 bln US\$ in 2008, the value of the exports of Kyrgyzstan significantly dropped by 27.2 percent in 2009 but bounced back by 26.3 percent to 1.5 bln US\$ in 2010 (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports showed a similar development increasing by 8.4 percent in 2010 to 3.2 bln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). This resulted in a trade deficit of 1.7 bln US\$ in 2010, compared to 2.5 bln US\$ in 2008 (see graph 1). Deficit with the Commonwealth of Independent States alone amounted to 1.2 bln US\$ (see graph 2). Major deficit was also recorded with Eastern Asia (-687.0 mln US\$). Trade was concentrated among a few partners: in 2010, 5 (respectively 7) major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports (respectively imports) (see graph 3).

Exports Profile:

In 2010, 56.4 percent of exports were reported as commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere (SITC section 9) (see table 1). Other major commodity groups for exports included food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) and miscellaneous manufactured articles (SITC section 8), respectively with 12.8 and 9.5 percent of exported goods. Major destinations for exports were Switzerland, United Arab Emirates and Russian Federation (see table 4). Exports to Switzerland were almost exclusively commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere (SITC section 9). Over the last three years, top products for exports were gold (including gold plated with platinum) (HS code 7108), women's or girls' suits, ensembles, jackets, blazers, dresses, skirts (HS code 6204) and electrical energy (HS code 2716) (see table 3).



Graph 3: Partner concentration of trade in 2010



Imports Profile:

In 2010, imports were composed of 26.5 percent of mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3), 21.5 percent of fmachinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) and 15.4 percent of food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1). In addition to petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710), other major imported goods over the last three years were medicaments (excluding goods of heading 30.02, 30.05 or 30.06) (HS code 3004) and petroleum gases and other gaseous hydrocarbons (HS code 2711) (see table 5).
