
Imports: CIF, by origin **Exports: FOB, by consumption Trade System: General** 

## Overview:

After three years of continuous increase marked by a peak of 1.7 bln US\$ in 2008, the value of Madagascar's exports dropped by 34.3 percent in 2009 and amounted to 1.1 bln US\$ (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports showed a less pronounced development with a drop by 18.0 percent in 2009 to 3.2 bln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). This resulted in a trade deficit of 2.1 bln US\$ (see graph 1). Large deficits were recorded with South-eastern Asia (-711.8 mln US\$), Eastern Asia (-473.5 mln US\$) and Sub-Saharan Africa (-282.5 mln US\$) (see graph 2). In 2009, exports were concentrated among a few partners while imports were diversified: 10 major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports compared to 15 major partners for imports (see graph 3).

## **Exports Profile:**

Madagascar's exports were composed largely of miscellaneous manufactured articles (SITC section 8). In 2009, its exports dropped by half and represented 43.3 percent of total exports (see table 1). Other major commodity groups for exports were food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) and manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6), respectively with 26.2 and 8.8 percent of exports. France, USA and Germany were the three largest markets for exports (see table 4). Over the last three years, top exported products were jerseys, pullovers, cardigans, waist-coats and similar articles (HS code 6110), men's or boys' suits, ensembles, jackets, blazers, trousers (HS code 6203) and women's or girls' suits, ensembles, jackets, blazers, dresses, skirts (HS code 6204) (see table 3).



## Graph 3: Partner concentration of trade in 2009



## **Imports Profile:**

In 2009, manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) and machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) accounted respectively for 36.1 and 27.9 percent of imported goods (see table 2). Other major commodity groups included mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3) (10.4 percent) and food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) (8.0 percent). Over the last three years, top imported products were petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710), structures (excluding prefabricated buildings of heading 94.06) (HS code 7308) and yarn of carded wool, not put up for retail sale (HS code 5106) (see table 5).
