Imports: CIF, by origin

Overview:

From 2005 to 2009, the value of the exports of Mauritius dropped on average by 4.7 percent each year and amounted to 1.8 bln US\$ (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports showed a continuous increase marked by a peak of 4.7 bln US\$ in 2008 before declining by 20.2 percent in 2009 to 3.7 bln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). The trade deficit narrowed from 2.3 bln US\$ in 2008 to 2.0 bln US\$ in 2009 (see graph 1). Deficits with Southern Asia and Eastern Asia amounted respectively to 747.8 and 556.8 mln US\$ in 2009. The trade balance recorded a surplus of 216.6 mln US\$ with Developed Europe. By partners, exports were more concentrated than imports: 9 major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports compared to 16 major partners for imports (see graph 3).

Graph 1: Total imports, exports and trade balance



Exports Profile:

Two commodity groups accounted for a large part of Mauritius' exports: miscellaneous manufactured articles (SITC section 8) and food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) represented respectively 49.3 and 33.9 percent of exported goods in 2009 (see table 1). Exports of miscellaneous manufactured articles (SITC section 8) dropped on average by 0.2 percent each year since 2005 while food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) increased on average by 1.0 percent each year. In addition to United Kingdom, other major destinations for exports included France and USA (see table 4). Major exported products over the last three years were t-shirts, singlets and other vests, knitted or crocheted (HS code 6109), cane or beet sugar and pure sucrose, in solid form (HS code 1701) and prepared or preserved fish; caviar (HS code 1604) (see table 3).





Graph 3: Partner concentration of trade in 2009





Imports Profile:

In 2009, imports were composed of 23.4 percent of machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7), 20.4 percent of food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) and 18.1 percent of manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) (see table 2). Over the last three years, top imported products included petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710), fish, frozen, excluding fish fillets (HS code 0303) and motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport (HS code 8703) (see table 5).
