Overview:

After several years of continuous growth marked by a peak of 2.6 bln US\$ in 2008, the value of the exports of Mozambique dropped in 2009 but increased again in 2010 by 4.5 percent to amount to 2.2 bln US\$, still well below its 2008 level (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports, on the other hand, continued to decrease (in 2010 by 5.3 percent) to reach 3.6 bln US\$. This resulted in a trade deficit of 1.3 bln US\$ in 2010, slightly lower than the 2009 deficit of 1.6 bln US\$ (see graph 1). This deficit came largely from trade with Sub-Saharan Africa (-0.8 bln US\$), Southern Asia (-0.2 bln US\$) and Western Asia (-0.2 bln US\$) (see graph 2). Trade, however, recorded a surplus with Developed Europe (+0.3 bln US\$). Exports were more concentrated among partners: in 2010, 4 major partners accounted for 80 percent of exported goods compared to 12 major partners for imports (see graph 3).

Graph 1: Total imports, exports and trade balance



Exports Profile:

In 2010, manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) was the largest commodity group for exports and accounted for 52.4 percent of exported goods (see table 1). Other major commodity groups included mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3) and food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) with respectively 19.9 percent and 13.9 percent of exports. Netherlands, the top partner for exports, accounted for 52.7 percent of exported goods (see table 4). Other major destinations for exports in 2010 included South Africa and Portugal. A large share of exports to Netherlands (98.1 percent) were manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6). Top exported products over the last three years were unwrought aluminium (HS code 7601), electrical energy (HS code 2716) and unmanufactured tobacco; tobacco refuse (HS code 2401) (see table 3).



Imports Profile:

Imports of machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) decreased by 14.6 percent and accounted for 26.0 percent of imported goods (see table 2). Imports of mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3), on the other hand, increased by 22.2 percent and represented 19.9 percent of imported goods. Other major commodity groups included commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere (SITC section 9) and manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) respectively with 17.3 and 12.6 percent of imports in 2010. Top imported products over the last three years were petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710), motor vehicles for the transport of goods (HS code 8704) and electrical energy (HS code 2716) (see table 5).
