
Overview:

Imports: CIF, by origin

After several years of continuous growth, the value of the Poland's exports dropped by 20.5 percent in 2009 and amounted to 136.6 bln US\$ (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports showed a similar development with a decline of 28.9 percent in 2009 to 149.6 bln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). This resulted in a trade deficit of 12.9 bln US\$ in 2009 (see graph 1). Trade with Eastern Asia, Commonwealth of Independent States and Developed Asia-Pacific recorded deficits respectively of 17.5, 4.9 and 2.5 bln US\$ in 2009 (see graph 2). Major trade surpluses were recorded with Developed Europe (+15.5 bln US\$) and South-eastern Europe (+1.5 bln US\$). Both exports and imports were diversified across partners: in 2009, 16 (respectively 17) major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports (respectively imports) (see graph 3).

In 2009, a large share (43.0 percent) of Poland's exports were machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) (see table 1). Other major commodity groups included manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) and miscellaneous manufactured articles (SITC section 8) respectively with 19.1 and 12.7 percent of exports. In addition to Germany, other major destinations for exports included France and Italy (see table 4). From 2007 to 2009, top exported commodities were motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport (HS code 8703), parts and accessories of the motor vehicles of headings 87.01 to 87.05 (HS code 8708) and reception apparatus for television (HS code 8528) (see table 3).


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

Graph 3: Partner concentration of trade in 2009







Imports Profile:

In 2009, machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) also accounted for a large share of imported goods: 35.1 percent (see table 2). Other major commodity groups included manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) and chemicals and related products, n.e.s. (SITC section 5) respectively with 17.0 and 13.7 percent of imports. From 2007 to 2009, top imported products included petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, crude (HS code 2709), motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport (HS code 8703) and parts and accessories of the motor vehicles of headings 87.01 to 87.05 (HS code 8708) (see table 5).
