Overview:

In 2010, exports of Togo amounted to 770.4 mln US\$, a 175.1 percent increase compared to 2007 (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports amounted to 855.5 mln US\$ in 2010 compared to 787.1 mln US\$ in 2007 (see table 2 and graph 1). This resulted in a trade deficit of 85.1 mln US\$ in 2010 (see graph 1). This deficit came largely from trade with Developed Europe (-268.9 mln US\$), Developed North America (-39.1 mln US\$) and Eastern Asia (-38.6 mln US\$) (see graph 2). Major surplus was recorded with Sub-Saharan Africa (+296 mln US\$). Togo's exports were diversified in 2010: 15 major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports compared to 19 major partners for imports (see graph 3).

Graph 1: Total imports, exports and trade balance



Exports Profile:

In 2010, the majority of the exports of Togo were inedible crude materials (except fuels), animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes (SITC sections 2+4) and manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6): they accounted respectively for 37.0 and 23.3 percent of exports (see table 1). Major destinations in 2010 were China, Benin and Burkina Faso (see table 4). More than 97.0 percent of exports to China were inedible crude materials (except fuels), animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes (SITC sections 2+4). The top commodities for exports in 2010 were cotton, not carded or combed (HS code 5201), portland cement, aluminous cement, slag cement (HS code 2523) and gold (including gold plated with platinum) (HS code 7108) (see table 3).



Graph 3: Partner concentration of trade in 2010







Imports Profile:

Togo's imports in 2010 were composed of 24.2 percent of machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7), 23.7 percent of manufactured goods classified chiefly by material (SITC section 6) and 15.1 percent of mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3) (see table 2). In addition to petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710), other major imported products in 2010 were portland cement, aluminous cement, slag cement (HS code 2523) and medicaments (excluding goods of heading 30.02, 30.05 or 30.06) (HS code 3004) (see table 3).
