Overview:

After two years of continuous growth marked by a peak of 3.2 bln US\$ in 2007, the value of Malta's exports dropped by 24.7 percent in 2009 and amounted to 2.3 bln US\$, well below its 2003 level (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports showed a less pronounced development with an overall increase over the last five years (an average annual growth rate of 1.1 percent) (see table 2 and graph 1). In 2009, it declined by 21.5 percent to 4.0 bln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). This resulted in a trade deficit of 1.8 bln US\$ in 2009, compared to 2.1 bln US\$ in 2008 (see graph 1). Trade balance of Developed Europe, nearly -2.0 bln US\$, accounted for a large part of this deficit (see graph 2). Surpluses were recorded with South-eastern Asia (+132.1 mln US\$) and Northern Africa (+80.0 mln US\$). By partners, Malta's trade was relatively diversified: 14 (respectively 12) major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports (respectively imports) (see graph 3).

Graph 1: Total imports, exports and trade balance



Exports Profile:

Machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) was the largest commodity group for exports in 2009: it accounted for the majority (57.4 percent) of exported goods (see table 1). Its exports dropped by 23.9 percent in 2009. Other major commodity groups included miscellaneous manufactured articles (SITC section 8) and chemicals and related products, n.e.s. (SITC section 5) respectively with 17.2 and 11.9 percent of exported goods. Top partners for exports were Germany, Singapore and France (see table 4). Exports to Singapore and France were largely machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7). From 2007 to 2009, diodes, transistors and similar semiconductor devices (HS code 8541) was the top commodity group and accounted for 39.7 percent of exports in 2009 (see table 3). Other major exported products included medicaments (excluding goods of heading 30.02, 30.05 or 30.06) (HS code 3004) and electrical apparatus for switching or protecting electrical circuits (HS code 8536).



Graph 3: Partner concentration of trade in 2009



Imports Profile:

Imports of machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) dropped by 16.0 percent in 2009 and accounted for 39.7 percent of imported goods (see table 2). Imports of food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1)miscellaneous manufactured articles (SITC section 8) decreased respectively by 17.1 percent and 21.3 percent, representing respectively 15.2 percent and 11.9 percent of total imports. From 2007 to 2009, top imported goods included electronic integrated circuits (HS code 8542), petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710) and other aircraft (for example, helicopters, aeroplanes); spacecraft (HS code 8802) (see table 5).
