
Imports: CIF, by origin

Overview:

After a peak of 7.6 bln US\$ in 2008, the value of the exports of Yemen dropped by 17.5 percent in 2009 to 6.3 bln US\$ (see table 1 and graph 1). Imports showed a similar development with a decline by 12.9 percent in 2009 to 9.2 bln US\$ (see table 2 and graph 1). The trade balance recorded a deficit of 2.9 bln US\$ in 2009, slightly below the deficit in 2008 of 3.0 bln US\$ (see graph 1). By MDG regions, trade recorded deficits with Developed Europe (-1.7 bln US\$), Western Asia (-1.6 bln US\$) and Developed North America (-0.6 bln US\$) (see graph 2). However, surpluses were recorded with South-eastern Asia (+1.0 bln US\$), Southern Asia (+0.8 bln US\$) and Eastern Asia (+0.5 bln US\$) among others. Compared to exports, imports were more diversified across partners: 6 major partners accounted for 80 percent of exports compared to 19 major partners for imports (see graph 3).

Exports	Profile:

In 2009, exports of mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3), which accounted for 89.5 percent of Yemen's exports, dropped by 16.8 percent. Other major commodity groups included food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) and machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7), which accounted respectively for 5.8 and 2.3 percent of exports and declined by 4.2 and 57.9 percent in 2009. Top markets for exports in 2009 were China, India and Thailand (see table 4). From 2007 to 2009, major exported products were petroleum oils, crude (HS code 2709), petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710) and oils and other products of high temperature coal tar (HS code 2707) (see table 3).







Graph 3: Partner concentration of trade in 2009







Imports Profile:

Yemen's imports of food, live animals, beverages and tobacco (SITC sections 0+1) decreased slightly by 0.4 and accounted for 26.5 percent of imported goods. Other major commodity groups included machinery and transport equipment (SITC section 7) and mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials (SITC section 3): they accounted respectively for 23.4 and 20.9 percent of imports. From 2007 to 2009, top products for imports were petroleum oils, other than crude (HS code 2710), wheat and meslin (HS code 1001) and motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport (HS code 8703) (see table 5).
